Who Are We?

The Noble Hill-Wheeler Memorial Center is located on a hill, just off Joe Frank Harris Parkway, in the Cassville community. It is a restored Rosenwald School that was built in 1923 as the first school for black children. Noble Hill was built to standard specifications in the Bartow County School System. The school was closed in 1955 when all schools for black children in Bartow County were consolidated to form the Bartow Elementary School. Today, the center serves as a heritage museum that reflects black culture, from the late 1800s to the present.


Past Events
